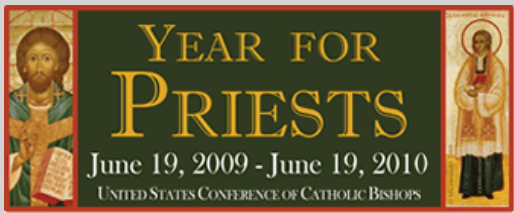

Dear Friends,

Next weekend we'll be reflecting at Mass about the meaning of the priesthood and the need to pray for vocations to that life and to the diaconate and the religious life. It's no secret that the priesthood has received some terrible blows to its standing in the community of late. We continue to lament and disdain and despise the terrible actions of a few who have harmed the youth of our Church community and who have set back the regard we need to have for the service of the priesthood in our parishes and dioceses. Some have called this time of Church history as the "perfect storm" that washed over the community. Many still need to be healed and to receive the solace that we can give and must give.

If any "good" has come from these Church scandals it is our vigilance and constant awareness that we need to safeguard the young from those who would abuse them and do them irreparable harm. In our own diocese and parish, we follow closely and rigorously the Virtus program which sensitizes us to the needs of the young and of families. We incorporate these ideals in all aspect of parish life – from the way we treat the young to the people who supervise our children in sports, the classroom, scouting, and other extracurricular activities. Even in the sacristy, we have adults on hand to make sure that both young children and clergy feel that they interact in a wholly calm and safe environment. We don't lament these concerns or activities; rather, we utilize them to make sure that such abuse will never again darken our Church gatherings and lives. Rather, we would bewail or deplore a lack of concern and a lack of awareness on our part. That is why the diocese and the parishes ask all volunteers who work with the young to engage in the Virtus program. How wise it is in a world that can, sadly, be inimical to the young across the entire spectrum of experience.

Within all this clergy scandal and other abuse scandals re the young, some of may have placed, even unintentionally, some psychological separation between ourselves and the ministerial priesthood. The Year for Priests can help restore some balance. The ordained priesthood – as flawed and as human as its members are, have been since the time of the apostles – is central to Catholicism. The pope made this point recently: "the truth is that the greater the faithful's awareness of their own responsibilities within the Church, the clearer becomes the specific identity and inimitable role of the priest as pastor of the entire community, witness to the authenticity of the faith, and dispenser of the mysteries of salvation in the name of Christ the Head. The function of the clergy is essential and irreplaceable in announcing the Word and celebrating the sacraments, especially the Eucharist. For this reason, it is vital to ask the Lord to send workers for His harvest; and it is necessary that priests express joy in their faithfulness to their identity." So let us pray for priests that they may be faithful, humble, courageous, and strong. Let us also pray for those who are called to this sacrament of Holy Orders. Perhaps it would be good to recall what has just happened in our Catholic world. On October 11, 2009, the Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI canonized several new saints for the Church, among them were two people familiar to you – now Saint Damien de Veuster (1840–1849), the Hawaiian missionary to the lepers, and Saint Mary of the Cross (Jeanne) Jugan (1792-1879), the French foundress of the Congregation of the Little Sisters of the Poor. These heroic individuals – one a priest and one a tireless worker for the elderly – are truly an inspiration for our Church. We offer them our prayers of intercession for this Year for Priests that through them we might have an increase of those who are listening to the Lord and being called to serve. Loquere, Domine, quia audit servus tuus. Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening. Pray for us, Saint Jozef Damien and Saint Jeanne Jugan. Help us in all our trials to be faithful as you were to Christ. Amen.

A short bit of thanks to all who send best wishes to me when I was down with a virus – not the flu! I wouldn’t wish this one any person, so stay healthy. Sickness, of course gives you pause (not paws), time to reflect on God’s goodness and our dependence on Him. Amen.

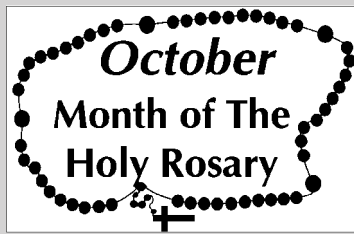

**Q.** *Are there variations on praying the rosary besides the traditional prayer pattern?*

**A.** October is traditionally known as the month of the rosary, with the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary celebrated on October 7. The rosary traces its origin to those who wanted to imitate the monks' daily psalm prayers but could not memorize the psalms. They began using familiar prayers instead. Soon three sets of five mysteries based on Jesus (replacing the 150 psalms), each having an Our Father, ten Hail Marys and a Glory Be attached to each mystery, set the rosary pattern.

On November 21, 1973, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops commented on the rosary in their pastoral letter on *Mary, Behold Your Mother: Woman of Faith*. They reminded Catholics that the rosary's importance stemmed not from reciting prayers but from time spent reflecting on the mysteries.

Rosary prayer times can have "an instructive use of readings from Old Testament as well as New..." along with hymns and "time periods of silent prayer." Some have developed mysteries for various occasions such as a rosary for the sick.
