We're very proud of our boys and of their coach, Michael Malloy. God bless them for their efforts and their accomplishments.

What a nice memory for the Class of '09 as their completed their year of grace among us in our parish school. Along with all their memories, we hope that they will take to heart all that they learned in their years here. We celebrated their graduation on June 9th, and it was a grand evening for them. More on this later.

It always seems like the end of the year even though it's only June. But this is a time for endings and beginnings. A word of thanks to several groups who have served us in these past months so well: To our adult choir, who helped us to pray at the 11 A.M. Mass on Sundays and who now come downstairs to help us in their new place near St. Joseph's altar. Their beautiful sound has elicited rounds and rounds of applause, so well deserved! Thanks, David, and all the members.

Our thanks also go to the ushers. I mention them from time to time because they engage in such an important ministry week after week. They help to greet the lost or timid among us. They make sure we have a place to sit. They gently nudge us when we need to move down a bit in the pew. They take our offering up to the Lord each week. They are there to make sure an ambulance is called when needed. They help us to form our lines when coming to receive Holy Communion. They even let me know when something needs fixing or repair. Thanks to all our ushers again and again for your tireless service.

We don't want to forget the members of the contemporary ensemble who sing and play at the YOSA Masses twice a month at 5:30 P.M. It's no secret that the congregation swells in numbers on a YOSA Sunday evening. Thanks to Bob and all those who help us raise our voices to the Lord.

We have other needs before that. Even painting for the water-marked ceiling has to stand in line this year for its turn in the budget. Time marches on. Father Greg is now a part of our parish family. I hope you will introduce yourself to him. Don't forget Father's Day coming up. Let's pray a special prayer this year for all the dads (and moms) who are working hard to find a job. And let's not forget God this summer. The pope recently spoke about the need to have fun-filled vacation times, but he warned that such vacation time or hectic workweeks must never distract us from dedicating a little time each day and, especially every Sunday, to God. We must set aside time in life for God, he told us, to open our lives to God with a thought, a meditation, small prayers – never forgetting Sunday, which is the Lord's Day.

The pope quoted one of the saints: "He who neglects contemplating God is deprived of the vision of the light of God; he who is carried away

with worry and allows his thoughts to be crushed by the tumult of the things of the world is condemned to the absolute impossibility of penetrating the secrets of the invisible God." We must allow God to enter into our being. Let Sunday be the day when we dedicate ourselves to celebrating the Body and Blood of the Lord among us, Corpus Christi, today's feast. Let's allow the beauty of sacred music and the Word of God enter into our hearts. Only in this way will life become great, become true life.

The pope reminds us, too, that faith is not just about thinking: it involves the whole of our being. It touches the wholeness of our lives and makes us whole. God made us flesh and blood and entered into our tangible world. We have to try to encounter God with all the dimensions of our human life. Perhaps that would be a good meditation for this summer. Allow God to penetrate your life. Even amidst the strife of the world and sour notes that can distract us from what is beautiful, we must find our path to touch the divine and never be overwhelmed by anything that would draw us away from God. It is possible. Remember that with God all things are possible. Don't ever let the poor choices of a few turn you away from God. Instead let God lead you to overturn what is wrong in our world so that the light of God's love may shine forth. Place your needs in our Lord's Sacred Heart, which we celebrate on June 19th. Remember St. Paul, whose year we close this month on June 29th. Think of the kindness of Blessed Junipero Serra, the founder of the California Missions whose day we celebrate on July 1st. So many wonderful men and women we reflect upon each day of the summer. Ask them to pray for you when you need some assistance. Oremus pro invicem. Soli Deo Gloria. Ubi amor, ibi oculus.

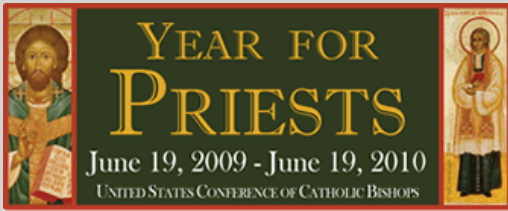
Why was the name for this Sunday changed from Corpus Christi to the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ?

The Lectionary revised by Vatican II changed the name of this feast from Corpus Christi, the feast of the body of Christ, to the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Although several reasons prompted this change, the primary ones focus on the fullness of the sacramental reality.

Christ is fully present in the bread and wine which are transformed by the power of the Spirit into the body and blood of Christ. While the term "body" was seen as adequate, the fuller sacramental reality is better expressed by "body and blood." The emphasis on the "blood" of Christ was highlighted by the availability of the cup for all communicants, something previously restricted only to priests. This availability provided the opportunity to explore the rich meaning of Christ's blood for our faith lives.

Blood has always been linked to life and to union with others, especially blood relatives. Drinking from the cup symbolizes Christian willingness to share Christ's sacrifice. Sharing the cup represents our commitment to be united as one family. In Mark 10:38, Jesus asks his disciples, "Can you drink the cup that I drink?" By drinking from the cup, we respond yes to Jesus, committing ourselves to love and serve others. As you partake of the body and blood of Christ, reflect on the commitment you are making to be of service to God's people.

Pope Benedict XVI has declared a "Year for Priests" beginning with the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus on June 19, 2009. The year will conclude in Rome with an international gathering of priests with the Holy Father on June 19, 2010.

VERY IMPORTANT INFO for all parish and school volunteers & coaches...

In order to volunteer with any activity involving youth at St. Angela Merici School or Parish, one must be fully compliant with volunteer standards, as required by the Diocese of Cleveland. This includes attending one Virtus training session, having fingerprints on file at the parish and completing a volunteer packet. Many of you are aware of the requirement to attend a Virtus training session, but don't realize you also must have the signed documents as well as the fingerprint record on file. ***This applies to all parish and school staff, all school volunteers, all CYO coaches, all Scouting leaders and all YOSA volunteers.***

If you have previously attended a Virtus training session, you should register online at www.virtus.org. You may or may not have completed this online registration at the time of your training session. Once you have attended the live training session and registered online, you will receive monthly articles about keeping our children safe, and the Web site tracks how many you have read or not! Reading these updates *is considered part of the Virtus training requirements — it is an ongoing responsibility, not an option!*

I find these articles to be very informative and address current issues that the training session did not cover. Recent topics have included: digital camera and camcorders, cell phone use (and abuses), Internet safety and bullying, etc. These are some of the most pressing issues for parents today and the Virtus Web site gives great advice on these topics and others in very short, easy-to-read articles.
