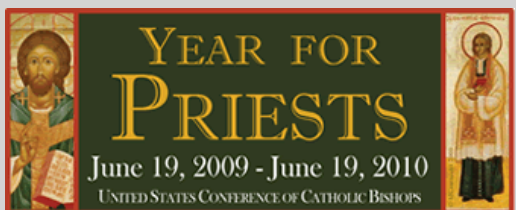
THE VISITATION SHRINE

Dear Friends,

This weekend, I am away to Pennsylvania to preside at a Mass honoring our parishioners Dr. and Mrs. Ted Castele. This is taking place in the Magnificat Chapel of the Villa Maria Community Center in Villa Maria, PA, the headquarters of the Humility of Mary Sisters who serve in so many ways in our diocese. I am honored to be asked and will extend our parish's best wishes to Jean and Ted Castele who will be receiving the Mother Madelaine Award. *Ad multos annos.*

This past week, we began another year of the Parish School of Religion (PSR) for our young people. Please pray for them that this will be a great year for spiritual growth and formation. Our deepest thanks goes to our DRE Linda Heiss, to Marie Kay, our teachers and staff, and our parents for their self-sacrificing support and hard work.

Thinking about education and formation, I was reading an article the other day about young people away at college and university. Sometimes our young people are attending schools where they will experience for the first time an environment in which Catholicism wasn't the prominent aspect. I'm confident that parents have shared with their children the existence of Campus Ministry centers (both at Catholic schools and non-Catholic schools) and of so-called Newman Centers (named after Cardinal Newman) where young people may attend Mass and share with others who have a similar Catholic background.

At times our young people are beset with homesickness together with the pressures that a college education can bring about. Spirituality can be susceptible to new twists. Parents and family aren't around to promote Mass attendance. Fellow students and faculty may present disparate religious views, and a young person may find that all these combine to have a negative impact on their faith experience.

Luckily, the Campus Ministry and Newman Centers offer solid support, along with neighboring parishes in college towns and locales. Immersing oneself in such communities can provide needed anchors for faith in a fast-paced and hectic world. Such connections can open up new worlds of service, retreats, sports, dinners, etc. for young men and women. Within such a culture, our children can broaden their religious knowledge and experience as they learn about humanities, philosophy, music, science, history, art and the whole range of human achievement and endeavors. Some students even begin the RCIA process in college.

Recent studies have shown that when young people attend Mass regularly from childhood and

throughout their studies, they remain faithful for their entire lives. You might want to read some of these studies put out by such reputable organizations as the PEW Charitable Trusts (<http://religions.pewforum.org>) and others like them. A strong foundation in faith through the family and support during formative years provide the keys to a healthy and strong spirituality. Those who do not have such support are in real danger of drifting away from God and from faith. As a famous saint once said, there is no such thing as cheap or inexpensive grace. Let us pray during this autumnal season for all young people and for parents that faith remains strong and vital in their lives.

Speaking of autumn, the leaves do seem to be changing rather quickly this year, don't they? I'm not sure what this portends or heralds, but I hope it is not the harbinger of a tough winter. Please, God, we would like to have our recent plantings around the corner of West 210 and the new Visitation shrine get a solid foundation themselves before the onslaught of winter winds, of snow and ice. Brrrr. Somebody get the afghan my mother knitted for me! Actually, I do like winter, only at the right time.

Winter means flu season again. I hope that you have been reading the missives from Therese Whitmore, our parish nurse. You may also wish to read more about the h1N1 Virus at <http://www.usccb.org/liturgyswineflu.shtml>. All of us should take actions everyday to stay healthy by covering our noses and mouths when coughing or sneezing, throwing away tissues, washing hands with soap and water, avoid touching eyes and noses and mouths, and avoiding too much person-to-person contact with those who are infected. We shouldn't panic but be filled with common sense. We can also do the "wave" of peace as opposed to the handshake of peace if we get too worried! The Centers for Disease Control remind us to stay home if we are sick and avoid too much contact with others if at all possible. Continuous updates from the CDC are available at www.CDC.gov/swineflu.

We will continue to be most careful in our parish. Our extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion are urged to wash their hands often; they may certainly use the bathrooms and sinks in the community room and in the sacristy whenever they so desire. As we follow the bishops' guidelines, we will continue to offer the Precious Blood for Holy Communion for those who must so choose due to their celiac-sprue condition. It is their choice to receive and their need for the Eucharist.

During this month, I am also giving talks at Holy Spirit in Avon Lake and at St. Luke in Lakewood for the updating of extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion. Perhaps I'll see some of you at these

venues. If you wish to become an EM, please see me or Fr. Greg. If you have attended a session for updating, you still need to be officially commissioned by me or Fr. Greg sometime in church. See us after Mass to receive your commissioning (verbally done) and your certificate for the next five years. If you have any questions, please see us. Likewise, for those of you taking Communion to the homebound, remember that you should see the priest celebrant or deacon before Mass if you wish to exit with the priest at the end of Mass, OR bring your pyx into the sacristy after Mass if you choose not to accompany the priest at the end of Mass. It is your choice. What we should never do is get the hosts early and then sit in the pew for Mass. This would be disrespectful to the Eucharist.

Look for the blessing of pets and animals coming up soon on October 3^d at noon. I won't bring Izzy out unless my nieces decide to help me out with the cat carrier or the cat leash. Izzy gets enough holy water by living in the rectory anyway. We allow her into the living room when we have guests to watch her. She can also go out on the back porch, but she doesn't seem to like all the animals around. Too much stimulation.

A note to thanks to all of you who have been asking about my brother-in-law, Greg who is battling ALS. He is a very courageous and faithful man. He and his family are most thankful for your prayers and best wishes. Many who were taught by him or my sister have fond memories of his academic prowess, coaching abilities, and all-around genial demeanor. We think of him each day.

Another word of thanks to our four captains who coordinate communion to the homebound on weekends. I had a great meeting with them last week, and I told them how much the parish is indebted to them for doing so much in regard to helping those who cannot make it to Mass. They need your help if they are to reach the almost 70 people who receive Holy Communion in their homes. Again, many hands make lighter work. This is a tremendous ministry. Please think of calling to assist our captains Elaine Voinovich, Jerry Lear, Mike Sweeney, and Lois Vysoky. Call me first, and I'll get the word to them. To the four of you, our heartfelt thanks and appreciation.

More next week. Where is September going! Oremus pro invicem. Soli Deo Gloria. Welcome back choir members for the adults, children, and contemporary ensemble. Welcome to Lawrence Wallace who is no directing/leading the contemporary group. We're happy and lucky to have you along with David. God Bless You. Don't forget to pray for the unemployed and the underemployed this week.
