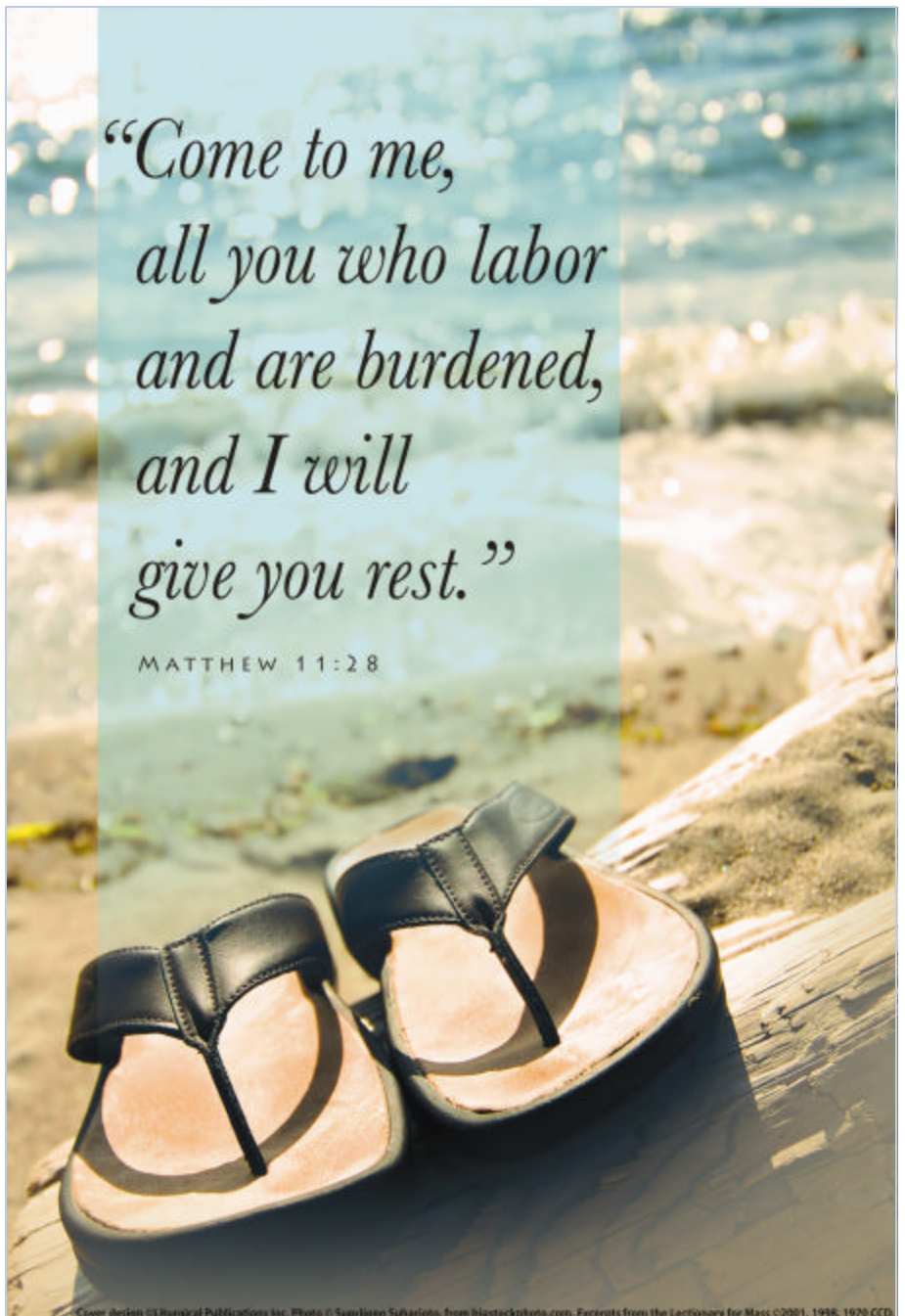

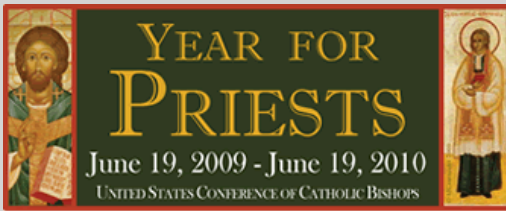
OUR MISSION STATEMENT

Dear Friends,

As school begins, here's a vocabulary quiz that I saw recently in the New York Times. Test your knowledge, your spouse's knowledge, or your children's knowledge about the difference between these words: straightened and straitened; gibe and jibe; teaming and teeming; egg yolk or egg yoke; adverse and averse; insure and ensure; turbid and turgid; stationary and stationery; complement and compliment. It's always fun to deal in the world of words. English is a complicated but rich and growing language. It is alive, and I hope well, in all the schools our children are attending.

Best wishes for a relaxing Labor Day. This traditional end-of-summer weekend is the harbinger of fall activities. Cooler nights and football games. Wishes for a beautiful autumn. These are the days that seem to come alive in our area of northeastern Ohio. I hope and pray that it will be a good season for all and that we give thanks to God for the grandeur of creation in its myriad forms.

Most of us, I guess, plan our calendars according to the school year, not the calendar year. At least in parishes this is the case. So, happy new year to all. I mentioned to our school children at the all-school Mass last week that this is the time to set your goals. Begin your year well. Don't wait to start studying but tackle the challenges immediately. Otherwise, we would find ourselves playing catch up for the rest of the year, and no one wants that to happen.

Perhaps it is the same in our spiritual lives. What goals do we have for these coming months? Before we get caught up in the whirlwind of activities that mark our days, we need to have that vision of life and spirit to guide each day. For some of us, it may be that we need to spend more time in personal prayer. Just a few moments a day can spell the difference between a quiet soul or a disquieted soul. Maybe we need finally to open that Bible and read. The prayer form of "lectio divina" – praying with a passage of Scripture – is a time-honored tradition in our Catholic life.

Now is the time to make sure we are steadfast in our weekly participation at Eucharist. We take solace and strength from our community celebration as we center our lives on the most important prayer, the Mass. The Eucharist is the source and summit of our lives. It needs to be the anchor that orients our entire week and our entire lives. Here we celebrate Christ. Here we meet Christ in the most important way.

It was Carl Sandburg, I believe, who said, "Nothing happens unless first we dream." Not daydream, but dream. What are your dreams? We should ponder a few of them as we move from week to week this year and see what progress we are making on our dreams for the future, both as individuals and as a parish family. Even the Book of Proverbs has a similar sentiment: "Where there is no vision, the people perish" (Proverbs 29:18).

I have a few dreams and visions that I have shared with our staff and our Parish Pastoral Council for the future. I'll be sharing them with you, too, as time moves on. From time to

YEAR FOR PRIESTS

**The Discovery of a Vocation:
The Journey Begins with Baptism**

Considering the possibility of priesthood for many seminarians and priests began when they were boys or young men; some where older when they discovered the possibility to serve in this vocation. But much of the invitation, regardless of one's age, is found in a number of experiences that take place in the family, the parish or a catechetical setting.

Whether it is a married couple who models the Christian faith and encourages their children to think about a religious vocation or it's a special presentation that is offered in grade school, many priests have cited these as foundational in "planting a seed."

For others, it's a matter of personal experiences with holy and joyful priests who make the priesthood attractive. It may also be a fellow parishioner who suggests that a gifted man ought to think about the priesthood.

Regardless of each man's reason, it seems the most influential factors for a man to embrace this possibility are: family support, priestly example, a personal invitation or a vocation program in childhood or adolescence.

The idea is that a "culture for vocations" should be promoted in all areas of ecclesial life. The Diocesan Vocation Office and seminaries of the Catholic Diocese of Cleveland offer a number of programs and opportunities for young men to discover the possibility of priesthood and young adults to think about the religious vocations.

RECESS AND CAFETERIA INNOVATIONS FOR STUDENT WELLNESS

Based on the recommendations of St. Angela's Wellness Committee and the feedback from students, parents and staff, St. Angela Merici Parish School has launched several innovations on both the playground and the cafeteria to meet our students' needs and promote policies of student wellness. Key initiatives include:

- **Play Zones at recess**, organized by Mrs. Jean Strippoli (our Physical Education Teacher), will provide a variety of physical activities from which students may choose. The goal of Play Zones is to provide safe and non-competitive activities so that all students are physically active during recess. *A special thanks to our Parent Teacher Connection (PTC) for funding this initiative.*
- **Staggered times for recess and lunch** are designed to minimize serving wait time in the cafeteria and to reduce time spent in recess transitions. In addition, our youngest students (K – 2) will have additional time in the cafeteria since it takes the younger students longer to eat than the older students.
- **Increased supervision** at both lunch and recess will include teachers as part of the supervision team.
- **More access to gym** during recess by restructuring the school's master schedule to provide more space (including indoor recess days) for physical activity.
- **New seating arrangements in cafeteria** will promote student acceptance and respect while providing students the opportunity to make positive choices.
