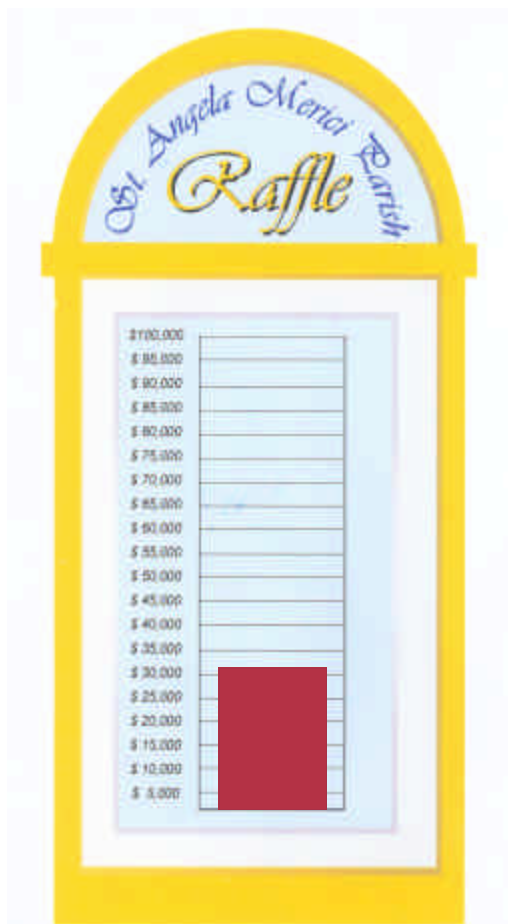

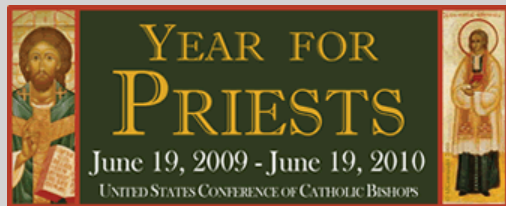

Dear Friends,

This past week we were blessed to celebrate our parish patron, **Saint Angela Merici**, on January 27th. Our blessing with the relic last weekend and our school Mass in her honor were great moments of grace for all of us.

Now this week we join with the whole country to **celebrate Catholic Schools Week**. Our own school has a strong tradition of almost ninety years of service to the parish and the entire surrounding community. We rejoice in the dedication of our faculty, staff, and administration. We count on the loving support of the whole parish to help our school be the tremendous enterprise that it is. I hope that you will spend some time at the open house to see for yourself what contemporary Catholic education is all about.

Remember that even if you didn't attend Catholic school or don't have children in a Catholic school today, **you are still feeling its positive effects in your life**. Beyond the benefits of faith formation and quality education, our cities and our suburbs receive a direct impact from our Catholic schools. They assist in offering educational alternatives, thus making our public schools stronger and less crowded. Together with other parochial schools, our Catholic schools help in strengthening our neighborhoods and providing stability in our towns, thus influencing real estate, taxes, offering employment, using local merchants, etc. Think of what St. Angela Merici School has done in nine decades and what we can do in the next nine decades of existence. All of this, of course, is up to our entire congregation. We must be watchful and vigilant to make sure that our school remains strong and vital for the future. Thank you for taking on that challenge for the benefit of future generations of students and families.

This week we will celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord on the 2nd and Saint Blaise on the 3rd. Jesus is the light of all nations, and blessed candles (Candlemas Day is the 2nd) remind us of this in a beautifully symbolic manner. Then we used blessed candles for the Blessing of Throats on the feast of Blaise. Here is the prayer that you can say yourself to invoke this saint's intercession for the coming year or for use at any time.

**Through the intercession of Saint Blaise,
Bishop and martyr,
May God deliver you (us) from every disease
Of the throat and from every other illness:
In the name of the Father, and of the Son, +
And of the Holy Spirit. Amen.**

Look up Blaise's life on the Internet to familiarize yourself with this most popular saint in the calendar.

A couple of weeks ago, I spoke about our new crucifix in the making. Last week I met with the artist/sculptor, and he will be coming to our parish during the last week of February to bring some life-size figures to show us exactly what the new crucifix will look like. These figures will be made of temporary materials to show the exact size of the work and to help in the determination of placement, etc. I'll let you know what afternoon he comes so that you can come and take a peek and a quick glance for yourself. I'm rather excited as are all who took the time to come to my office to look at some drawings and small exemplary figures. The crucifix will be traditional as befits our church architecture but will be stunning in design and execution. A great gift of superb artwork for the glory of God, for our prayer life and our worship together, and for teaching our young people for generations to come. Thank you to our benefactors and to God himself.

Have you seen the new film Avatar yet? I heard a wonderful Catholic review of the film recently. The reviewer spoke of the beauty of the film and its marvelous imagination. He was, however, disappointed in the non-biblical approach to faith. Our biblically rooted faith is grounded in the transcendent and yet personal experience of God, a God of power yet of love. Our God is not reduced or able to be reduced simply to some type of force or to some pantheistic mystery in the universe. No, our God is a personal God. Our God is the God present at the creation of the universe as the Creator. Our God is the God who called Abraham and Sarah. Our God is the God who became one with us in Jesus. Our God is the God who calls us to be disciples. Our God is the God who claims us in love. Our God is the Holy Spirit who guides us to eternity. How sad only to have a Hollywood God in the movies who compromises the essential mystery of our loving God. Let's help our young people not be seduced by such a force that can only go so far and no farther. God is not just some force we tap into. Our God created the rhythms of nature. We know that the heavens proclaim our God's handiwork but know that God is truly above all things and loves all things. This is the God in whose image we have been created. Let's continue to introduce young people to the God of our faith who is all and over all.

Have a great week. Thanks so much for supporting our raffle and our Carnivale. Together we can do great things for God and for our

community, if each one does his or her share. It's that simple. God bless you. Thanks for thinking about me and my upcoming surgery on the 19th. Again, round two for skin cancer, but not life-threatening. Watch your sun block! Oremus pro invicem. Soli Deo Gloria.

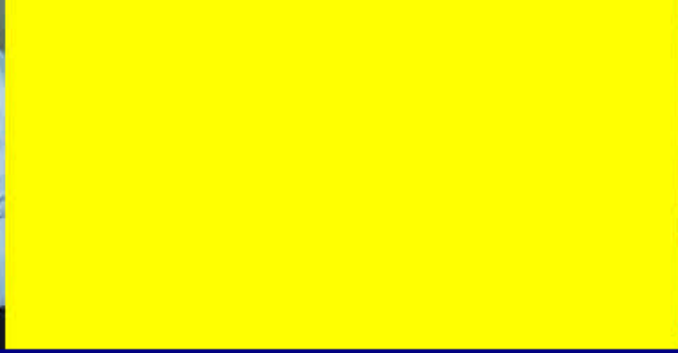
SOCIAL JUSTICE COMMISSION
