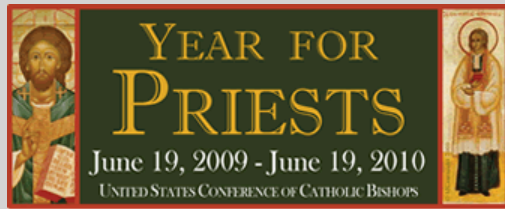

Dear Friends,

This weekend we celebrate the solemnity that was known formerly at **Corpus Christi, now called the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ**. During what is called the Ordinary Time of the Church year, we pause to celebrate some extremely important beliefs/doctrines of our faith. Last week we centered on the Most Holy Trinity. This week, it is the sacrament of sacraments, the chief among the seven sacraments, the Blessed Sacrament, the Eucharist, the center of our life and worship each day, the source and summit of Church life, the completion of our Christian initiation, the Sacred Banquet, the foretaste of the heavenly banquet, the Breaking of Bread, the Eucharistic Assembly, the memorial of the Lord's Passion and Resurrection, the Holy Sacrifice, the Holy and Divine Liturgy, Holy Communion, Holy Mass – all these titles to try and express what is truly inestimably inexplicable. **The real presence of Christ – body and blood, soul and divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ, the whole Christ truly, really, and substantially present** – is contained within this most blessed sacrament. It is the perfection of the spiritual life and the end to which all the sacraments tend. This substantial presence of Christ is truly Christ, God and man, wholly and entirely present.

In this Eucharist, then, the whole Church is united with the offering and intercession of Christ. And not only the members still on earth – but we are united to those already in the glory of heaven. In communion with and commemorating the Blessed Virgin Mary and all the saints, the Church offers the Eucharistic sacrifice – we are, as it were, at the foot of the cross with Mary, united with the offering and intercession of Christ. How awesome this is! How necessary it is, therefore, to be at the Mass, especially on the Lord's Day! We come to pray for all those who have come before us in faith. We call to mind our family and friends, our community of faith.

Now in our time, the Church is asking us to look carefully at the Mass so that we might make it even more accessible to us using our language and sharing with our brothers and sisters across the planet to offer the one sacrifice of Christ on our altars. **The revised Roman Missal (www.usccb.org/romanmissal) will show us more how this will be accomplished** in our country and in all English-speaking lands to “catch” up with the rest of the language groups. You'll discover more about this online and in the near future with talks and reading materials that will be made available. **We won't be changing the Mass or the ritual. We will be changing some words to help us pray in a better manner.**

Last weekend we were graced with the presence of Msgr. Bill Elliott who spoke eloquently regarding the Trinity and his 50 years of priesthood. It was a beautiful Mass (I listened from afar as I often do from the office or even the rectory), and I hope that I can get a copy of his remarks to share some of them with you regarding the priesthood from a man who has lived it well. Thanks to the choir and all ministers who helped in the liturgy and to all who helped with the reception and who came down to greet Msgr. Elliott. Fr. Murray, the retired pastor of St. Brendan's was also in attendance. The weather was great; the church looked appropriately festive; the day was memorable for him, his friends, and family who were there.

So the scaffolding will be up and down as needed for repairs in the church. The window project for the school will be underway in earnest. Lots to do. In fact, we replaced the concrete pad that is directly in front of the main church doors on the south façade. Amazingly, the old material simply fell down into the hall below, showing us that we more than likely had some water seepage there over the years. Now all is well. The new concrete is sturdy and well placed. I hope you also noticed the new apron at the 210th Street lot entrance. Nice job. The roof repairs are completed for now on the church and the rectory buildings. The new steel downspouts are in; there is no temptation for robbers to steal the steel (bad pun).

This week is graduation for our school. This is a great class of young men and women, and we are proud of their accomplishments. We are also saluting some **alumni/ae** who we feel are great role models for the young people, as well as giving recognition to some we are naming as **honorary alumni/ae**. These are people whom we feel have been particularly supportive of our school and parish families, and we want to pay tribute to their unsung work and contributions to life. We will honor 12 in all. Among these is Mrs. Lennie Foster (retiring after 30 years with us); we wish her well in her new life of “leisure”. The school will have a few changes, as it normally does each year. Mrs. Ptak and Mrs. Zell have told us that they will be moving on after their years here to pursue work in other venues. We thank them for their time and hard work for our students. During these next weeks, Mrs. Urban will be looking at hundreds of **résumés** from interested potential teachers. Please don't send me or her any more names. Any applicants worth their salt already know about job postings! With the job market being as it is, especially in education, we have many from which to choose. Once Mrs. Urban and her faculty make some assessments, they will then recommend them to me for employment. Let

us pray that we will continue to include more great educators for our spectacular school.

Now that we have three priests on staff, we are able to accept requests for individual Mass intentions on an earlier basis for the rest of the year and for 2011. In fairness to all who wish to schedule a Mass intention for the 6:30 AM, the 8:30 AM during the week and for weekend Masses, we try to limit Masses intentions to two per intention. One Mass each weekend is designated as **PRO POPULO**, i.e, in Latin "for the people" – for the people of our parish of Saint Angela Merici. In this way, you know that each member of our community is being supported by the prayers of the Mass each week. That's part of canon law, and I think quite nice. So when you see "Saint Angela Merici" in the list of Mass intentions in the bulletin, now you know why! It's for you!

Sometimes, we won't be able to honor all requests for Masses. For example, in the fall, the priests are all scheduled for a **mandatory convocation** / meeting of the priests of Cleveland in October. This is a requirement of the bishop so that he may gather all of us together at one time for special prayer and discussion. Like all dioceses, we do this in Cleveland from time to time. Not unlike businesses or other organizations, this convocation-style of meeting is meant to help build up the local Church and clergy.

So that we may also honor the priests' vacation/retreat/continuing education schedules, there may be times when we have communion services rather than Mass. This is to make sure that one priest is not saying five Masses in a day when we might have three funerals, hospital duty, emergency calls, weddings, etc. with only one priest available. As a matter of fact, we still have a Saturday morning Mass at 8:30 AM. **Many parishes have done away with a Saturday morning Mass due to personnel; we have not.** Mass is always available here every day of the year except for the special schedules of the Triduum. We also continue the service of having a Sunday evening Mass for the convenience of our parish and the surrounding area. We don't mind saying this Mass and providing for the special needs of others. It is part of our contribution to the wider Church in the diocese, and I'm glad that we can offer it. Add to this the fact that priests get vacation times and retreat times and continuing education times in their "contract" with the diocese. That adds up to six weeks per priest times three equals 18 weeks of "juggling" the schedule. Not unlike your office or place of work, eh? It's the same with us.

I've mentioned in the past that we will be having a small survey for your perusal coming up. I want to know if we are meeting your

needs in several areas, e.g., liturgy, Mass times, etc. Personally, I think a schedule of weekend Masses at 4:30 PM, 7:30 AM, 9:30 AM, 11:30 AM, and 5:30 PM would be nice to allow time between Masses. Most people on the west side of Cleveland know the various Mass schedules of parishes. I think it might be easier for us to be known at the church that has Mass on "the half hour" and not have such a "mixed" schedule. The current schedule was put in place the year before I arrived here. I've been here now about 7 years. Maybe it's the seven-year-itch for scheduling, but at any rate I'd like to know your feelings on the matter so that we can best serve the most people. Many young people have spoken to me about having "later" Mass times. Some people really like early Masses; some really like later Masses, e.g., around noon. We won't be able to add an extra Mass – even with an additional priest – since we don't fill all Masses now anyway. And I am sure that in the next years we'll be back down to two priests when the priest shortage truly begins to hit home. **Remember that this year we've only had two ordinations in the diocese. Two.** Couple that with numerous retirements and some deaths, and you've got the picture of the future. The bishop sent us Father Spolny because of the **temporary surfeit**, or oversupply, of priests that was caused by parish merging/closings taking place in this last year.

Some other matters of interest:

- I received a beautiful letter from a serviceman overseas who asked me to tell you how much he appreciates your prayers.
- Don't forget David Tidyman's concert at Trinity Lutheran across from Saint Ignatius today at 2 pm. Great program.
- We have a new youth minister in the parish! Michael Schwark has decided to move on to another parish situation; we have unanimously chosen Maureen Adler of our parish for this important post. Welcome to Maureen (Mo) Adler! Congratulations! Mo comes to us from a distinguished career in youth ministry and education at Saint Joseph Academy. We are all excited. She has met with our young people in YOSA, who are also excited. Great news for Saint Angela Merici! You'll learn more about her as the summer unfolds.
- I got a chance to visit my brother, Brother Bill, in Chicago for a couple of days recently. He hasn't been home for a year due to his commitments, so I decided to visit him. He is well and will probably come east sometime this summer to see his family, pet the rectory cat, and check up

on the nieces, nephews, and other assorted pets in the Lanning menagerie (household). I couldn't believe the changes that have occurred in that great windy city over the last years. I lived in Chicago for six years on-and-off – wow, what changes! I know that many of our parishioners have family members there, especially due to employment opportunities. Amazing city! I last lived there over 25 years ago. Even NYC has changed a lot since my years there.

- I am now in Cleveland 11 years since moving from NYC – Manhattan. This is my seventh year at Saint Angela Merici. My ordination was June 3, 1978 (32 years ago). Fr. Greg is 25 years. Fr. Joe is also 32 years a priest. With our three deacons, we have many years of ministry in total. Keep us in your prayers.
- The year of the priest is soon coming to a close. I hope that your prayers for priests and for vocations will come to great fruition.
- Next year the theme for Catechetical Sunday is the Sacrament of Matrimony. We are planning on starting Pre-Cana Marriage Prep classes here again in the near future, especially since we have some willing volunteers who have experience in this area ready to take up the charge! If you are interested, please give me a call.
- Dean Cotton of our Parish Pastoral Council and Elaine Stephens of the PPC have decided to step down after several years of serve on the council. Many thanks to them for helping our parish family and staff. We will have two more, I believe, starting this coming month. I'll let you know who has contacted me and who is interested.
- As you look at our weekly budget, I want to thank you for your contributions and support of the parish. Even in these tough times, people are great. We do need to work as hard as we can in this endeavor, though. With a new priest on staff and the "missing" Sundays when we don't reach our goal, we will be looking at an operating shortfall of \$100,000 dollars. **A fulltime priest is about a \$50,000 dollar footprint in the budget (salary, healthcare benefits, retirement contributions (mandatory), and that's without Social Security payments as clergy are required to pay the full amount, not the institutions they serve.** Whenever we don't reach our weekly goal, we need to step back and re-assess whether or not we can do the projects that we'd like to do and the outreach we'd like to accomplish. I am confident that such numbers

will turn around. I still believe that when we have our raffle in the late fall and winter, we could do great things simply by selling tickets and getting the hustle into our step, looking sharp, and "getting our skates on" as they say.

In a parish our size of 3,200 families, if every family unit/household could sell two books of tickets during the raffle (not using their own money, mind you), that would be 6,400 tickets according to the new math. At \$20 a book, that would be \$128,000. At \$25 it would be \$160,000. Then, perhaps, we could begin to realize our dreams of no tuition for elementary school. It's being done in other parts of the U.S.A. The stewardship programs in those parishes and dioceses are not only thrifty but spiritually enriching. We'll talk about that later in the year.

- I'd still like to work on those windows in the rear (north end) of the church – even with some stained glass thrown in. Have you seen the Web site for the diocese that has the stained glass available from merged and closed parish buildings? Some of it is truly priceless. I'd be sad if all that gorgeous artwork left the Cleveland area for another church or diocese. After all, the hard work and sacrifice of fellow Clevelanders made those windows possible by craftsmen who no longer ply such a trade. It's a lost art in many parts of the world. I don't think it's even possible to make such windows anymore. Take a look at <http://www.hennigers.com>, at the Diocesan Web site, at www.church-inventory.com, and info@hennigers.com. There is a cool (awesome?) you tube site about putting old precious stained glass into new frames. It is entitled **Resizing Old Stained Glass Into New Spaces**. It explains how the process works at tremendously low prices in comparison to new stained glass. Just go to www.youtube.com and enter the title above. Very interesting!
- I also wrote about our projects for the vestibule and the Parish Center in recent bulletins. I hope you enjoyed those dreams, too.

Not much more room to tell my tales. I hope that this will be a productive summer for all and a restful one, too. Father Greg's 25th anniversary as a priest is coming up next weekend. I hope that you will stop by and give him your greetings. If you haven't met his family, this would be an excellent opportunity to do so. His dad is very involved in the Serra Club (promoting vocations and supporting priestly vocations in the Diocese of Cleveland especially).
