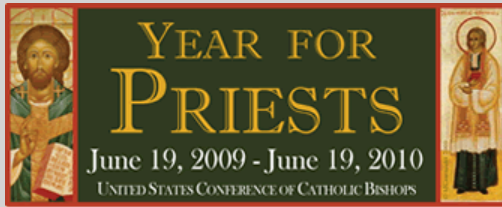

My doctor thought that food poisoning was the culprit of the day. Yuk. Those of you who have had such gastro challenges know the feeling. You just have to let it pass its time; you pray for many things, eh? Suffice to say, it has been a true Lent for me. But now, we're doing ok.

Thanks to all those who were kind in filling in for me, visiting priests, Fr. Greg, etc. Our staff is so great; they keep us humming no matter what.

And now the week of St. Patrick's Day and Saint Joseph Day. Two great days of the calendar. As Bishop Lennon reminded us in the last *Universe Bulletin*, we remember Patrick as the great evangelizer. May he intercede on our behalf to bring the life-giving message of the gospel to all in any way that we can.

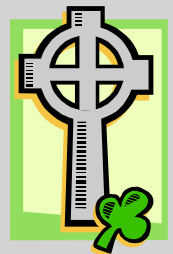

**CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP**

*In order to gain full benefit of our Lenten activities, reflection is essential. As the Body of Christ, we are called to be good stewards. In the time of Jesus, a steward was one of whom the owner of a household entrusted the management and care of property and other resources. To better understand what stewardship means today, it is helpful to reflect on key words that describe such a responsibility.*

- Christian stewards are **Faithful**. We treasure the gift of faith and carefully pass it on to others with dedication and generosity.
- Christian stewards are **Committed**. They give their all for that which they hold precious: the Gospel.
- Christian stewards are **Attentive**. It takes a certain amount of both humility and awareness to discern the gifts one has been given to share. By focusing on our strengths instead of weaknesses, we are apt to discover our gifts are and how to use them.
- Christian stewards are **Resourceful**. Rather than seeing a need to acquire more possessions, good stewards utilize what they have. How might we simplify our lives in order to focus on things that matter most?
- Christian stewards are **Thankful**. Fostering an attitude of gratitude in ourselves enhances our ability to recognize the fullness of life rather than focus on its deficits. Before going to bed at night, we might take a mental inventory of the day and thank God for the blessings received.
- Christian stewards are **Generous**. They give out of love rather than a sense of obligation. We might consider ways to give more of ourselves through acts of charity and justice.
- Christian stewards are **Bold**. The need to give witness to our faith can be daunting. It is easier to keep it a secret between ourselves and God. We witness our faith each day through what we say and how we respond to others. We can make a more intentional witness by educating ourselves about social injustices and seeking ways to be involved in solutions.

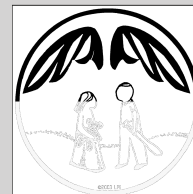
